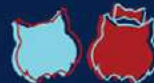

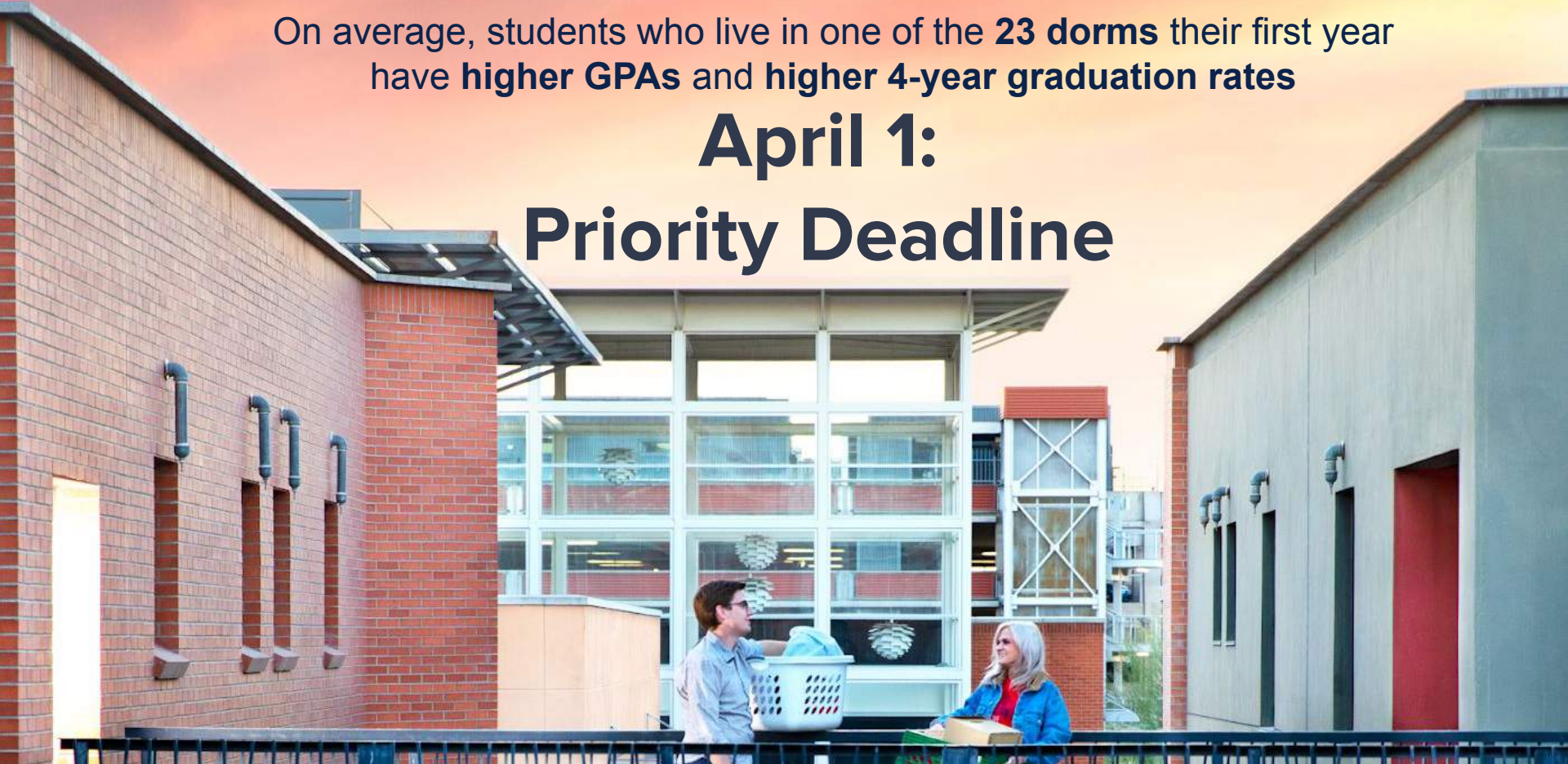

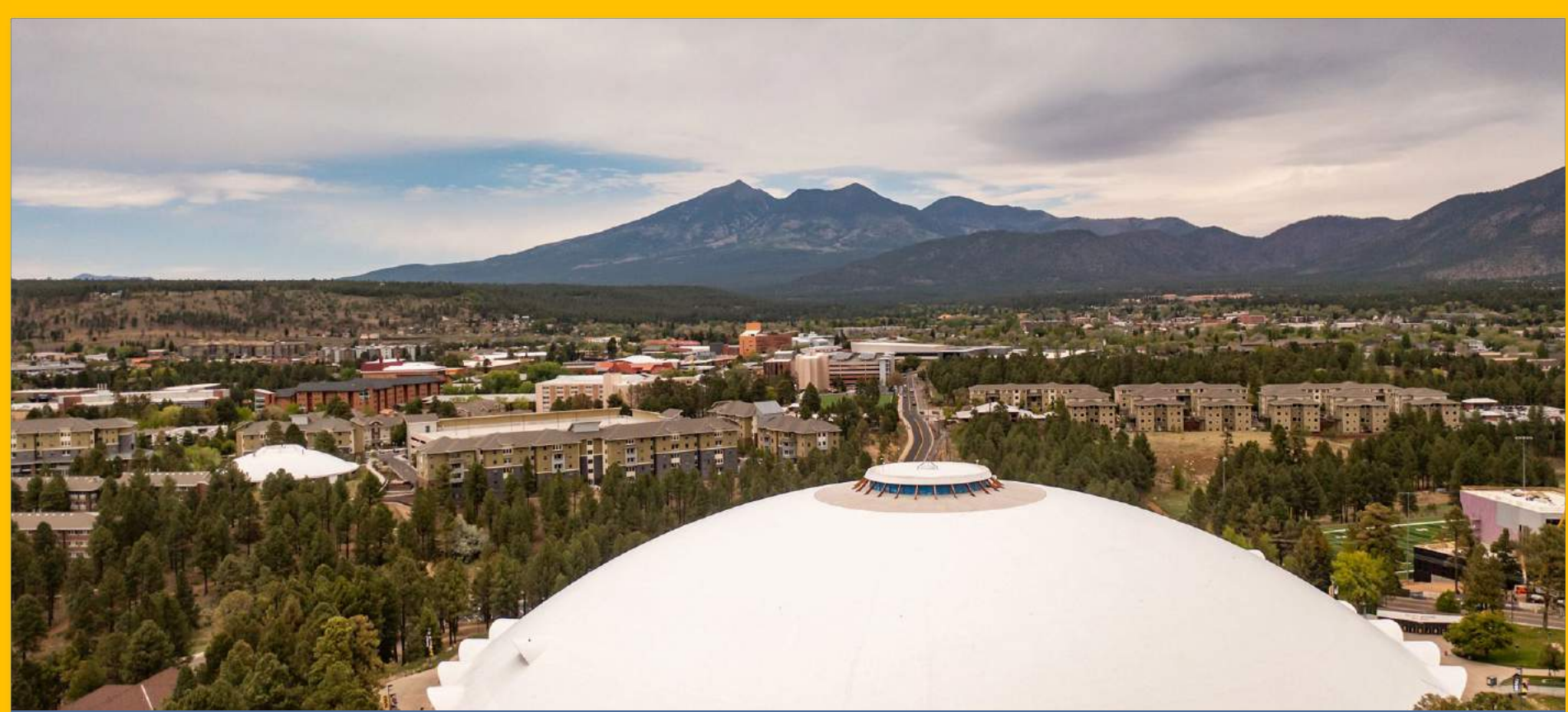

## January 15



### Regular admission date

ASU's regular admission date is Jan. 15. Make sure to complete your fall 2023 admission application by this date.



### FAFSA priority date

[Submitting complete, accurate FAFSA](#) by Jan. 15 means you will maximize the amount of financial aid you may receive in grants and other kinds of gift aid.

ASU's Federal School Code is 07081.



### Barrett, The Honors College regular admission date

### Activate your ASURITE User ID

Your ASURITE User ID grants you access to My ASU and university services. You'll find reminders for things like submitting your final transcripts, sending in your test scores and submitting your immunization forms.

When you activate your ASURITE User ID, you will select to have your ASU email forwarded to a personal account. It's important to check your email often for time-sensitive notifications and next steps about enrollment. You'll have access to your official ASU email when classes begin. You can check which email your ASU email is forwarding to by looking in the profile tab in My ASU.

# How New American University Scholars are awarded

An important update for fall 2023: Scholarship award amounts **may vary based on the campus of the student's major**. Changes to a student's major or campus may result in a scholarship amount adjustment. Admitted students are automatically reviewed for ASU merit scholarships through May 1.

ASU merit scholarships are only available to first-time, first-year students entering **ASU the semester directly after high school graduation**. If you enroll at another institution after high school

**ASU merit scholarships are awarded based on a combination of high school GPA in core competencies, the number of those competencies that have been completed and/or are in progress, residency status, and the student's admitted degree program and campus.**

New American University Scholarships are awarded at the time of admission based on information submitted on the admission application. We do not recalculate academic information for scholarship purposes after admission.

ACT or SAT scores are not required for award eligibility. Students can submit test scores for consideration and in some cases they can lead to scholarship upgrades. ASU must receive test scores by May 1 in order to consider them.

Arizona State University awards merit scholarships, called New American University scholarships, to incoming first-year students with outstanding academic abilities.

Use this tool to get an **estimate** of how much New American University scholarship money you **may be eligible** to receive. These are estimates to help you plan and are not guaranteed.

**Who is eligible for New American University scholarships**

- ASU merit scholarships are only available to first-time, first-year students entering **ASU the semester directly after high school graduation**. If you enroll at another institution after high school graduation for anything other than summer courses, you will no longer be eligible for the merit scholarship.
- New American University scholarships are available to full-time, on-campus students registered for iCourses and ASU Sync. They are not available to ASU Online students.
- By Arizona law, you must demonstrate lawful status to receive your New American University scholarship.

**How New American University scholarships are awarded**

- Admitted students are automatically reviewed for ASU merit scholarships through **May 1**.
- New American University scholarships are awarded at time of admission based upon information submitted on your application for admission. We do not recalculate academic information for scholarship purposes **after** admission.
- ASU merit scholarships are awarded based on a combination of your high school GPA in core competencies, the number of those competencies you have completed or have in progress, and the degree program, residency and campus that you're admitted to. Your ACT or SAT scores are not required for award eligibility. Changes in degree program, residency or campus may result in a scholarship adjustment.
- You can submit test scores for consideration, and in some cases they can lead to scholarship upgrades. ASU must receive your test scores by **May 1** in order to consider them.
- If you are offered a New American University scholarship, any funds you have earned through [RaiseMe](#) micro-scholarships will be included in the total ASU New American University scholarship you are offered. They are not added on top of the merit scholarship amount.
- Scholarship award amounts may vary based on the campus you are enrolled in. Changes in program, residency or campus may result in a scholarship amount adjustment.

# President Barack Obama Scholar program requirements

- Eligible to receive the Federal Pell Grant.
- Complete application for admission and submit FAFSA by Jan. 15.

## What it covers:

- Tuition and fees.
- Books and supplies.
- Some funding to help cover housing and meals.

## Arizona Promise Program Requirements

- Arizona resident.
- First-year student enrolling in the fall semester immediately following graduation.
- Full-time, degree-seeking student.
- Eligible for the Federal Pell Grant.
- Have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) of zero.
- Must be admitted to ASU for the fall semester by April 1.
- File a FAFSA and have a complete and verified financial aid file by April.

# Important Obama Scholars Eligibility Update

## Obama Scholars Program

To be considered for the [Obama Scholars Program](#), students must submit a completed application for admission, including application fee or waiver, official transcripts (unless choosing to self-report academic information), and the FAFSA, by **Jan. 15**.

### New for fall 2023:

We will use a student's self-reported information for Obama Scholars eligibility and awarding. Previously, all Obama Scholar-eligible students who self-reported had to submit a transcript by Jan. 15 to verify their self-reported information. With this change, students will be notified earlier about their financial aid package.

- Students will still need to submit a final high school transcript upon graduation that will be evaluated for discrepancies in self-reported information, which may result in an adjustment to their award.
- Students are reviewed for eligibility at time of admission based upon information submitted on their application for admission. We do not recalculate information for awarding purposes after admission. Students must have a completed application for admission on file by Jan. 15.

Students who choose not to self-report still must have a transcript and complete application for admission submitted to ASU by Jan. 15.
