





Students who enroll in CCB programs are a highly diverse group. With an average age over 30, most CCB students choose to attend a community college close to home to allow for full-time employment, care for family, and play an active role in their communities.⁽¹⁾

ON AVERAGE, CCB GRADUATES ARE

40% PEOPLE & 57% FEMALE

Additionally, CCB programs enroll students who are under-represented in baccalaureate degree attainment. More than 1/3 of all CCB-conferring colleges in the U.S. are high Hispanic-serving institutions and 40% of all tribal colleges confer bachelor's degrees.⁽¹⁾






We are keeping our doors open!

- Follows our regular admissions/application process for community colleges in Arizona including admissions for individuals under 18 and F-1 nonimmigrant students; everyone is accepted!
- Elementary Education and Special Education and Nuclear Medicine require additional applications and steps to enter specified courses
- Specializations within Public Safety Administration (e.g. law enforcement, fire science, and corrections and detention) may require acceptance to an academy or employment in the field



The Tribal College Dual Enrollment Program provides Arizona's high school students the opportunity to take college courses for both high school and college credit. Course costs are free to the student. Participating tribal colleges are reimbursed for tuition and fees associated with participating students. Effective September 24, 2022, the Arizona state legislature passed SB1300 allowing the Arizona Department of Education to reimburse the cost of books and instructional materials as well.



Who does the program serve?

How to get started?

The dual enrollment program requires high school districts to enter into an agreement with participating TCUs.

Why does this program exists?

General requirements for dual enrollment in Arizona are governed within the Arizona Revised Statute 15-1821.01.

In the 2015 Legislative session, the tribal college dual enrollment program was enacted. Thus, ARS Title 15, chapter 2, was amended by adding section 15-244.01 Tribal College Dual Enrollment Program Fund.
