New American University Scholarships

Scholarship award amounts **may vary based on the campus of the student's major**. Changes to a student's major or campus may result in a scholarship amount adjustment. Admitted students are automatically reviewed for ASU merit scholarships through May 1.

ASU merit scholarships are only available to first-time, first-year students entering **ASU the semester directly after high school graduation**. If you enroll at another institution after high school graduation for anything other than summer courses, you will no longer be eligible for the merit scholarship.

ASU merit scholarships are awarded based on a combination of high school GPA in core competencies, the number of those competencies that have been completed and/or are in progress, residency status, and the student's admitted degree program and campus.

New American University Scholarships are awarded at the time of admission based on information submitted on the admission application. We do not recalculate academic information for scholarship purposes after admission.

ACT or SAT scores are not required for award eligibility. Students can submit test scores for consideration and in some cases they can lead to scholarship upgrades. ASU must receive test scores by May 1 in order to consider them.

- New American University scholarships are awarded at time of admission based upon information submitted on your application for admission. We do not recalculate academic information for scholarship purposes after admission.

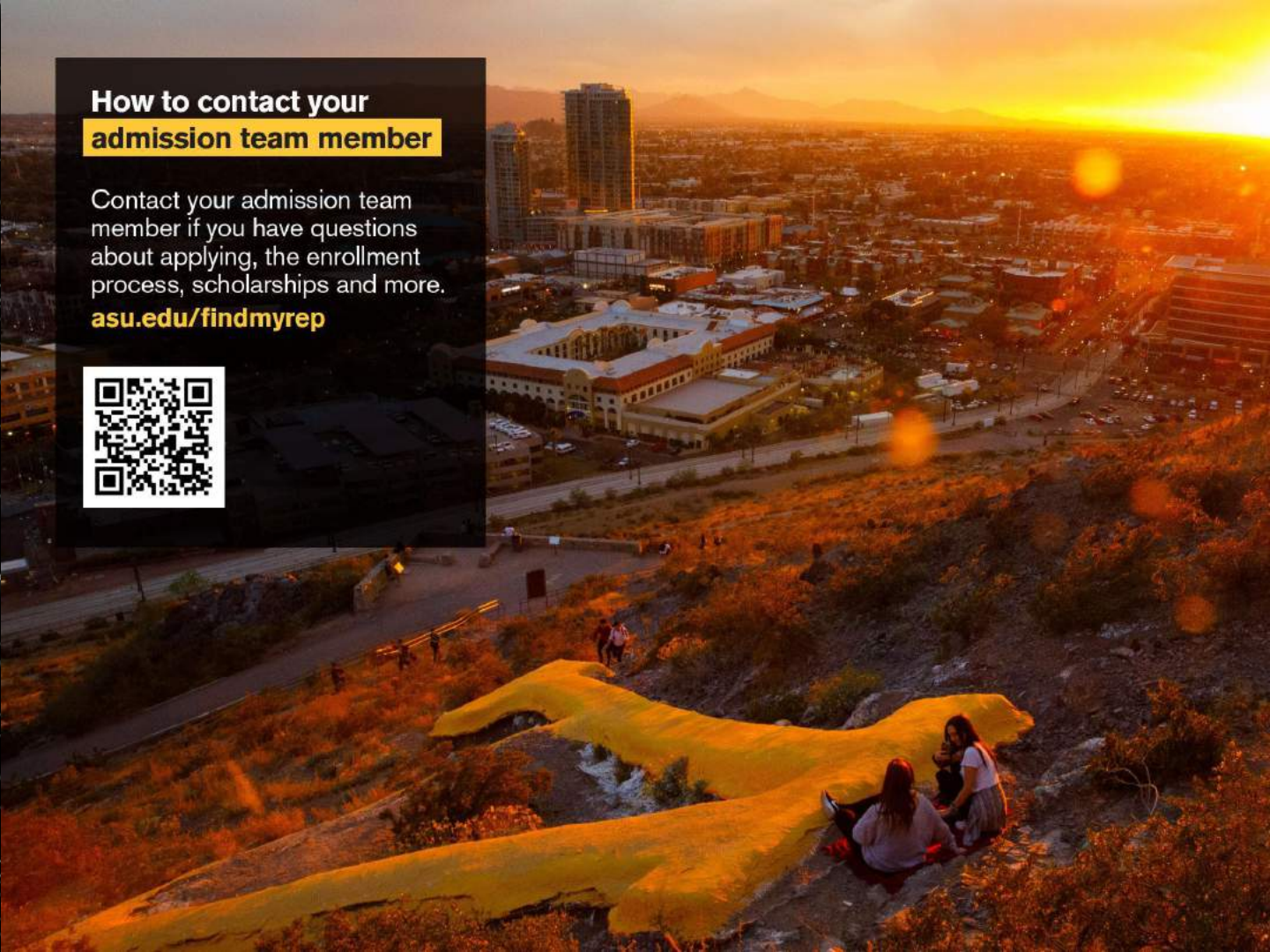
